Summer Learning Opportunities

Pre-college summer programs allow students to explore areas of interest and can help a student decide if a specific field of study is right for him.

Summer programs give students a chance to develop skills, meet new people and experience what it is like to live and learn in a college environment. Participating in these programs often motivates students to do well in their remaining time in high school – and may set them apart in the college admissions process.

Some programs are offered virtually, giving students a unique opportunity to participate in experiences without the cost of travel, room and board.

Below is a sampling of programs. While we do not endorse any programs, we are providing this list as a starting point for you to explore the many summer opportunities available. Areteem Institute Math Summer Camps

Visit: Areteem Math Summer Camps

Residential camp at Boston University for advanced high school students who love math. Problem solving in algebra geometry, probability and number theory.

Babson Summer Study for High School Students (virtual)

3+ week experiential online program for rising high school juniors and seniors to develop an entrepreneurial mindset and become innovators and changemakers. Students earn 4 college credits from Babson, the top-ranked college for entrepreneurship.

Beacon College Summer for Success Program

Program helps college-bound high school freshmen, sophomores, and juniors who learn differently build the skills, confidence, and preparation they need to successfully transition from high school. Students better understand their learning differences, recognize early stumbling blocks, and know what they need to succeed in their first year of college. Student must have a diagnosed learning disability.

Bentley University Wall Street 101 Summer Camp

Wall Street 101 Program is a competitive experiential learning program for rising high school juniors and seniors interested in global finance and investing, including stocks, bonds, currencies, commodities, and cryptocurrencies. Combining macroeconomics, valuation of securities, trading strategies and financial technology concepts, the Wall Street 101 Program is uniquely designed to help students understand the forces changing the financial services industry. A limited number of scholarships are available.

The Boston College Experience (limited virtual options)

Through adherence to its Jesuit mission, The Boston College Experience focuses on exposing students to a rich and rewarding college experience through coursework, extracurricular activities and reflection. Built into the programs are activities that help to prepare students for their college search and the transition into college life.

Boston Leadership Institute

One-week and three-week programs in STEM and business. Opportunities include science research programs, a competitive admissions program for students planning a pre-med track and business entrepreneurship.

Boston University Summer Journalism Academy (virtual, on campus options) Visit: <u>BU Summer Journalism Academy</u>

The Summer Journalism Academy gives high school students the opportunity to expand their skills and prepare for college. Each academy instructor is a working journalist, so what's taught is grounded in real-life experience. Each lesson is tied to its practical application, by giving students actual reporting assignments.

Boston University Summer Programs for Pre-College Students (limited virtual options) Visit: <u>Boston University Summer Term</u>

BU's long-running Summer Term pre-college offerings include a choice of one-, two-, three- and sixweek programs designed to prepare students for success in college. Students can earn credit, discover a new subject area, perform cutting-edge research or become immersed in hands-on learning.

Brown University Pre-College Programs (limited virtual options) Visit: Pre-College Program | Brown University

Brown Pre-College Programs are designed for high school students to explore the challenges and opportunities of the college experience without the pressure of formal grades. One- to 6-week courses offered. Limited scholarships available.

Bryant University Pre-College Summer Economics Program

Learn to apply economics to affect social chance. Develop data analysis skills and analyze current policy issues. Participants earn a certificate of completion from Bryant University. Scholarships available.

Bucknell University Engineering Camp

Engineering Camp is an academically challenging, hands-on introduction to engineering. Discover the many different areas where engineers apply their skills, study the latest technologies that shape the world and learn how the scientific phenomena studied in school are applied by professional engineers. Open to students currently in grades 8-11.

Carnegie Mellon University Summer Pre-College Programs

Case Western Reserve Pre-College Program (virtual)

Designed for students 13 and up. Each course features video lessons by Case Western Reserve instructors and access to mentors. The asynchronous program allows students to study anywhere, anytime and at their own pace. Programs in science, engineering, business and computer science.

Catholic University of America Pre-College Programs

Light the World! encourages participants to see theology in everyday life by exploring theological traditions, asking questions about the moral dimensions of contemporary issues, and examining how their faith calls them to lives of service. Programs also available: engineering, drama and architecture.

Champlain College Pre-College Programs

Champlain College offers residential pre-college summer programs for motivated high school students. Taught by industry-expert faculty, these intensive programs offer students the opportunity to explore areas of interest or take a deeper dive into a subject they already love. Columbia University Climate School Summer Programs

Intensive pre-college course designed to challenge and engage high-achieving students. Students receive a Certification of Participation and evaluations written by instructors.

Cooper Union Summer Stem (virtual, on campus options)

Summer STEM is an opportunity to try engineering for the first time or dive deeper into engineering teamwork. Each 3- or 6-week class covers the same topics and activities completed by Cooper Union undergraduates or explores student and faculty research projects. Selective program for students in grades 9-12. **Deadline approaching.**

Cornell University Pre-College Studies (virtual)

Get a head start on college by earning 3 to 12 credits and a Cornell transcript. Students choose from more than 100 regular undergraduate Cornell courses. Participants can also prepare for college applications with one-on-one admissions counseling.

Duke University Pre-College Programs (virtual, on campus options)

Advanced academic opportunities and an introduction to the college experience for students currently in grades 6-11. Courses give students access to cutting-edge curriculum and technology while connecting them with peers from around the world and influential professionals in their future field.

Georgetown University Pre-College Online Program (virtual)

Pre-college on-line courses for students 13 and older. Dynamic video lessons by Georgetown faculty plus access to mentors. Courses include cybersecurity, entrepreneurship, journalism, pre-professional topics, science, government and leadership.

Harvard Model Congress Leadership Summer Camp

Six-day experiential program designed to empower teenagers to become changemakers and leaders by launching impact initiatives under the guidance of experienced mentors from Harvard Model Congress. Gain in-depth knowledge of communication, public speaking, leadership, critical thinking, and teamwork. The program is organized and run by Harvard University undergraduates.

Choose from the two-week, non-credit academically rigorous Pre-College Program or the 4- and 7-week for credit Secondary School Program. Students get a true taste of college life and learn alongside high school students, college students and adults from around the world.

Students take subject knowledge to the next level through a challenging academic program that includes classroom-based lectures, labs and practical workshops. Collaborate with students in other disciplines in an Innovation Challenge and enjoy planned social activities in London.

Ithaca College Summer Pre-College Programs for High School Students Visit: <u>Pre-College Programs | Ithaca College</u>

Programs provide high school students with an opportunity to earn three college credits while experiencing residential living on a college campus. Options are Summer College, where students choose their own adventure with one course in the communications, environmental studies, health or natural science fields, Summer Theatre Conservatory or the Ithaca Young Writers Institute.

Johns Hopkins University Pre-College Summer Programs (virtual, on campus options) Visit: <u>Pre-College Programs | Johns Hopkins University</u>

On-campus programs feature lectures, visits from top researchers and experts, guest speakers and outings. Virtual programs are self-paced and primarily delivered asynchronously. College credit.

Landmark College Summer Experiences

Landmark College offers summer programs for students who learn differently that are designed to enable them to identify their learning strengths, learn specific strategies to be successful in formal academic settings and grow personally and academically in an intentional and supportive academic community. Participants are not required to have a diagnosed learning disability. Open to students 16-18 who have completed their sophomore year. Limited financial aid available.

Lebanon Valley College Actuarial Science Camp

Visit: Actuarial Science Camp | Lebanon Valley College

Week-long intensive program for rising high school seniors designed to help them determine their interest in actuarial careers. Program features interaction with actuaries and an introduction to relevant software and content.

Lebanon Valley College Health and Biomedical Sciences Summer Program Visit: <u>Health & Biomedical Sciences Camp</u>

Through lectures and hands-on investigations in state-of-the-art laboratories, students will be introduced to the fundamentals of disciplines such as molecular biology, neuroscience, physiology, pharmacology, immunology, and other medical sciences. In addition, students will interact with practicing professionals.

Loyola Marymount University Pre-College Programs (virtual, on campus options) Visit: <u>Pre-College Programs - Loyola Marymount University</u>

Academic pre-college courses combine lectures and small-group discussions designed to challenge students' critical and creative ways of thinking. Two-week non-credit courses (on-campus and online) and four-week on-campus college credit programs.

Marist Summer Pre-College (virtual, on campus options)

One of the top-ranked summer pre-college programs in the country. Students earn college credit and gain insight into a future college major. Courses include cybersecurity, pre-professional programs, Broadway at Marist, game design and sports communication.

Massachusetts Maritime Academy Sea, Science and Leadership Program Visit: <u>Sea, Science and Leadership Program | Massachusetts Maritime Academy</u>

Provides high school students with interactive, educational workshops that build confidence and decision-making skills while developing leadership qualities. Participants are immersed in the education and regimental lifestyle of a cadet through hands-on workshops and include use of a ship's bridge simulator, the Clean Harbors Emergency Operations Center, engineering labs, firefighting and more. Use code **SSLP2024** by May 1 for \$200 off the registration fee.

Miami (Ohio) University Summer Scholars Program

Week-long program for high-achieving students who will be juniors or seniors in the fall. Students participate in lively discussions, hands-on projects, and real-world experiences with university faculty. Participants who later apply to Miami Ohio will receive an application fee waiver, as well as priority consideration for admission and selective programs.

National Student Leadership Conference Summer Programs Visit: Pre-College Summer Enrichment Programs for Students

Thirty-three interactive programs at 13 prestigious locations. The National Student Leadership Conference provides an immersive pre-college experience that prepares students for life beyond high school. Students are able to explore a career concentration before going into college and declaring a major. Each NSLC program also contains a leadership curriculum designed to teach skills that can apply to all areas of life.

New York University High School Programs (virtual, on campus options) Visit: <u>High School Programs | NYU</u>

Led by NYU faculty, the programs are designed to introduce students to college-level concepts and scholarship and empower them to forge academic pathways in a variety of fields: Arts and Media, STEM, Humanities and Social Sciences or Business and Entrepreneurship. Credit and non-credit options available.

Northeastern University Accelerate Pre-College Programs Visit: Northeastern Pre-college Programs Boston

The Summer 2024 Boston programs give talented high school rising juniors and seniors from around the world the opportunity to participate in immersive, experiential programs with acclaimed Northeastern faculty members on Northeastern's Boston campus. Programs include Cybersecurity and Privacy, Engineering Innovation and Design, Ethics and Emerging Technologies, Games in Extended Reality and more.

Norwich University Future Leader Camp

Nine-day, military-style adventure that builds understanding of small-group leadership techniques, leadership ethics, teamwork, problem-solving and communication. Open to students currently in grades 9-11. Students who complete the camp may be eligible for a \$1,000/year scholarship to Norwich University.

Oberlin College and Conservatory Summer Programs

Each summer, the Conservatory of Music offers a series of music programs that span a variety of instruments and performance styles. Application recordings may be required. Enrollment is limited and some programs are no longer accepting applicants. **Deadline approaching.**

Oxbridge Academic Summer Programs

Summer programs in university classrooms at Oxford, Cambridge, Paris, Barcelona and New York. Designed to give bright and enthusiastic students a university-level introduction to topics about which they are passionate. Open to students 13-18.

Pace University Pre-College Summer Immersion Program

Intensive two-week program for rising juniors and seniors. Options include theater, becoming the author of your own story, art portfolio development, digital communication/social media, mathematics for the real world and more. Participants who enroll at Pace qualify for a \$3,000 annual merit scholarship and automatically receive three elective credits toward a Pace University degree.

Penn Engineering Summer Academy

The Engineering Summer Academy at Penn (ESAP) welcomes highly motivated and talented students to explore Engineering at the college level. The Academy's intensive, three-week programs combine sophisticated theory with hands-on practical experience in cutting edge technologies. Work with leading faculty while earning college credit, live on Penn's historic campus, and connect with students from around the world. **Deadline approaching.**

Quinnipiac University Summer Programs

Rhode Island School of Design Pre-College

Five week summer residential immersive program. Follow a college-level curriculum with day-long studio classes, visits to the Nature Lab and RISD Museum, critiques and final projects intended to forever shape the way participants approach art and design.

Savannah College of Art and Design Pre-College Programs

SCAD Rising Star for rising seniors interested in taking one or two college-level classes and building a professional portfolio. SCAD Summer Seminars offers student currently in grades 9-11 valuable experience while developing their creativity through art and design projects.

School of the Art Institute of Chicago Early College (virtual, on campus options) Visit: <u>SAIC Summer Institute</u>

Immersive program led by world-renowned faculty. Students create portfolio-quality work and earn college credit. Open to students ages 15-18.

Skidmore Summer Pre-College Program

Credit-bearing experience for high school students interested in exploring what they could be, study, and do in college. Enrollment includes support resources on campus, such as the writing center, library and more. Open to current sophomores, juniors and seniors.

Stanford University Pre-Collegiate Summer Institutes (virtual)

Stanford Pre-Collegiate Summer Institutes provide a taste of the Stanford classroom experience, and challenge students with advanced content not typically found in the high-school curriculum. Choose from 60 online summer courses that provide in-depth and interactive exploration of academic material. Courses are ungraded and are not awarded credit. Subjects include computer science, math, creative writing, social justice, philosophy, engineering, and more.

Stevens Institute of Technology Pre-College Programs

Thomas Aquinas College Great Books Summer Program

Participants also explore historic Boston and the Freedom Trail, kayak on the Connecticut River and enjoy a Boston Symphony Orchestra concert at the Tanglewood Music Center.

Tufts University Pre-College Programs (virtual, on campus options)

Programs offer ambitious high school students the opportunity to learn from renowned faculty, scholars and researchers and to experience a rigorous academic environment at a leading higher education institution. Limited need-based scholarships for some programs.

Within a supportive community, pre-college students are given the chance to take intellectual risks, dive more deeply into subject matter, and discuss questions that go beyond the realm of their high school curriculum. Some programs earn college credit. **Deadline approaching**; some programs have a wait list.

University of Delaware Edge Summer College Program

The UD Edge summer college program prepares high school students moving into their junior or senior year for a future as a successful college student. By emphasizing academic excellence, practical skill building and student leadership, Edge offers the challenge, independence and excitement of a learning experience that can only be found at a top national university. College credit.

University of Maryland Terp Young Scholars (virtual)

Terp Young Scholars is designed specifically for high school students (rising grade 10 to graduating grade 12). The program delivers an academic experience that is at the forefront of theory, thought and technology. Participants choose one three-credit course, attend class, study, work on projects, prepare for exams, and interact with their peers and regular UMD undergraduate students in a rigorous academic setting. Note that the on-campus program is available to commuters only.

University of Miami Pre-College offers both credit and non-credit programs for high school students seeking to gain college experience before graduating from high school. Upon completion, participants feel better prepared for the undergraduate admission process and gain confidence in their academic choices and ability to succeed in college.

University of Michigan "Joy of Coding" (virtual)

Jumpstart your introduction to the world of coding with this online python course from University of Michigan Engineering faculty. No prior coding experience required. The course is self-driven and asynchronous. Need-based financial aid available. Certificate of accomplishment awarded upon completion of the course.

University of North Carolina Asheville Pre-College Programs Visit: Pre College Programs 2024

UNC Asheville's Pre-College Programs introduce high school students to college-level study, university life and career options in a dynamic learning environment. Each one-week program offers deep immersion into an academic topic, challenging activities, and the opportunity to engage with industry professionals. Programs include River Ecology and Adventure, Video Game Design, Music Composition and more.

University of Notre Dame Career Discovery in Architecture Visit: Career Discovery for High Schoolers | Notre Dame

Geared toward high school students who are considering architecture as a college major, participants are exposed to the skills required in contemporary architectural practice as well as discussions of major topics impacting the world around us including historic preservation, accessibility, infrastructure and urban design. Career Discovery is intended to help participants decide whether they want to pursue architecture in college.

University of Notre Dame Summer Seminary Immersion

Led by priests, brothers, and seminarians of the Congregation of Holy Cross, the Summer Seminary Immersion Program (SSIP) is a two-week academic experience designed for young men 15-18 years old interested in deepening their relationship with Christ and His Church or who may have considered a calling to the priesthood or life as a religious brother. The program helps young men explore discernment of God's call through study of Sacred Scripture, Sacred Tradition, the office of the priesthood and the consecrated life.

University of Southern California Summer Programs

Four-week program for outstanding high school students. Courses are taught by USC faculty and experienced professionals for college credit. Areas of study include architecture, business, engineering, global studies, journalism, performing arts, pre-professional programs and writing.

University of Vermont Summer Academy (virtual, on campus options) Visit: <u>Summer Academy | University of Vermont</u>

UVM Summer Academy is an immersive, 4-week, for-credit academic program designed for motivated high school students who have completed Grades 10-12.

U.S. Coast Guard Academy AIM Program (virtual, on campus options)

One-week program that immerses the student in Academy life. Open to current juniors only. Discover whether the Academy experience is for you and whether you have what it takes to succeed. **Deadline approaching.**

U.S. Military Academy at West Point Summer Leader Experience

Weeklong immersion into the academic, military and social life of a cadet. Open to current sophomores and juniors only. U.S. citizen. **Deadline approaching.**

U.S. Naval Academy Summer Seminar

Open to current juniors. Strongly recommended for students who are seriously considering applying to the Naval Academy. Experience academic, athletic and professional training. Application to Summer Seminar serves as a preliminary application to Annapolis.

U.S. Naval Academy Summer STEM

Visit: USNA Summer STEM

A week of problem solving, exploratory learning, critical thinking and team building for students currently in grades 8-10. Students learn from Academy faculty, interact with USNA midshipmen and design and build STEM projects.

Villanova University Pre-College Summer Academy

Visit: Pre-College Summer Academy | Villanova University

Exceptional high school juniors and seniors, as well as incoming college freshmen, can select one threecredit course taught by Villanova faculty. The classroom experience is augmented by a one-credit college preparatory course designed to prepare students for successful college life. Courses include communication, the global religious experience, literature, psychology and more. Students also have the option of enrolling solely in the preparatory course.

Wake Forest University Summer Immersion Program (on-campus and virtual options) Visit: <u>Wake Forest Summer Immersion Program</u>

The Wake Forest Summer Immersion Program empowers high school students to manifest their goals. Through meaningful real-world experiences, robust academics, an inclusive campus culture, networking and mentorship, students are able to discover their passions and clarify their future pathway. Nineteen Institutes to choose from, including medicine, law, leadership, filmmaking and sports business.

Washington University in St. Louis High School Summer Scholars Program Visit: <u>High School Summer Scholars Program</u>

Students have the opportunity to enroll in courses for credit and study alongside undergraduates. Students select from a broad range of introductory courses in the humanities, social sciences, natural sciences and mathematics. This program is ideal for students who want to earn college credit, challenge themselves academically and explore courses in a specific major or subject. Open to current juniors.

Wentworth Institute of Technology ImpactLab

Two-week program for rising juniors and seniors interested in design solutions that make a difference in the world. **Deadline approaching.**

William and Mary Pre-College Summer Program in American History Visit: <u>Pre-College Program in American History</u>

Three-week residential experiences that integrate academic instruction and seminar discussion with site-based experiences and conversations with museum professionals. Open to rising juniors, seniors and college freshmen.

Worcester Polytechnic Institute Summer Programs (virtual, on campus options) Visit: <u>Summer Programs | Worcester Polytechnic Institute</u>

- Launch is an in-person commuter program for rising sophomores, juniors and seniors interested in using state-of-the-art technology while building hands-on laboratory experience.
- **Frontiers** is a residential two-week program for rising sophomores, juniors and seniors to explore a STEM major with a humanities and arts minor. Participants engage in college preparation workshops and social activities.
- **College Credit Jumpstart** is a five-week online program for rising juniors and seniors who are interested in earning college credit while experiencing a WPI course.
